Course Descriptions

Art in New York City: Each semester our art educator chooses a theme, perhaps, exploring self-portraiture through a variety of media (drawing, photography, printmaking, collage, etc). Each student will complete her/his own project which will correspond with some of the exhibitions that will be on view at the Museums we visit. A professional art historian and guide/teacher will lead lectures and field trips to both MoMA and the MoMA-owned P.S. 1.

Digital Photography/Storytelling: This class is an overview of the crowded field of digital photography. In this hands-on class, you will learn the components of composition and manipulation of digital images. You will learn to add a narrative track, special effects, and a soundtrack to render your own digital story worthy of posting on You Tube.

Engineering Options: An introduction to the Engineering Sciences: mechanical, electrical, and Civil. After a three-week overview of the field, students will select which area they wish to concentrate on during the next six weeks. All students will be expected to jointly work on a project to be demonstrated at the end of the semester. We will also have input from professional engineers on the history, theory and technique of the professions.

Latin Dancing: An excellent opportunity to learn new steps and meet other students who really enjoy music and dancing. You can also join in the end-of-year ceremony at LaGuardia's Little Theatre on December 10th, by performing all the dances you have learned! We will also have input from professional dancers on the history, theory and technique of dance.

Paying for College: Class will discuss how to afford college, apply for FASFA, and what to do if you are in over your head in college debt. This course will introduce the snowball effect and how to prioritize debts. Also, it will discuss how to remove and dispute items from your credit file and clean up your credit report.

SAT/PSAT Review [Math & Verbal]: Beginning with a diagnostic, and followed by weekly drills, students will learn the types of questions they will encounter; get advice about choosing a multiple choice answer; how to detect distracters; and, how to pace yourself with increasingly difficult questions. Special emphasis will be placed on the newest version of the SAT.

Spoken Word: In this class, students will improve their writing skills. They will explore different styles of writing—prose and poetry. At the end of this workshop, they will present their published work at the end of the year celebration.
